4 Positions Open - Seminary and Recent Graduates

UULM Congregational Organizers for Health Care June - Dec. 2010:

Promote, recruit and lead a congregation in a UULM health care educational component, develop leaders and engage congregants in interfaith healthcare campaigns and/or a community outreach project.

Stipend: \$1200 - \$1600 per congregation. This is a contract, not hourly, position, and the time needed to organize your congregation will vary. **One position is available with an extra Young Adult Project outreach component for additional stipend.**

Flextime: Work schedule is flexible to be fulfilled during the summer and fall (with preference for those able to start organizing during the summer). One evening and two Saturdays of training. Training will be set in June at the mutual convenience of the organizers. About 75 - 100 hours for the project.

For independent study credit, talk with your seminary. We can provide a reading list.

Candidates should currently be in seminary or a recent seminary graduate, able to listen, speak and write well, organize themselves and others, be open to people with different political and theological outlooks, show independent initiative, and be able to lead a small group study action circle in a congregation in Marin, Contra Costa, Alameda, San Francisco, or San Mateo county. Group facilitation, worship and organizing experience are desirable. Basic knowledge of Unitarian Universalism required.
